

Role Description: Course Rep

Course Reps represent students on their course. They play a key role in students having a voice about the things that matter to them, to have an impact on improving academic practices.

Course Reps find out about other students' academic issues and pass this information on to University staff, their Subject Rep and Hull University Union's President of Education so that they can enhance university education in Hull.

Aim:

Course Reps are responsible for gathering feedback from other students on their course. They attend Student-Staff Forums (usually twice per trimester) to pass on issues that need addressing and examples of good practice to academic staff, and then share progress with fellow students to keep them updated.

Key Responsibilities:

- Attend Hull University Union Course Rep training
- Regularly gather feedback from other students on your course
- Represent students' views to University staff at Student-Staff Forums
- Meet with your Subject Rep and other Course Reps to discuss issues
- Attend Course Rep Forums to share your feedback and impact with other reps and the President of Education
- Share updates and news from academic staff and the Students' Union with other students
