Chair – Matthew Evans (Vice-President Education – VPE). Secretary – Jacob Zobkiw (Education Co-ordinator – EC). Also in attendance: Tania Struetzel (Democracy and Governance Co-ordinator – DGC).

### 3. iHull: An Evaluation presented by Chris Turnock (Teaching Enhanced Learning)

Chris Turnock (CT) introduced the proposed changes to iHull and asked the Education Zone its opinion on what students would like from the app and which tiles to include. For instance, CT discussed the Bus tile, in which students can discover where available buses are and when they will leave from key locations, such as the Lawns and the University. Feedback was positive on this development. It was asked whether the tile would include Stagecoach and CT said the team would look into it.

On current system integrations it was asked whether eBridge would be available through the app. CT said it would, although eBridge will make way for Canvas in the new academic year anyway. Mature Students Officer asked about the capabilities of a Scarborough tile, and CT said that the app will be able to recognise the kind of student using it and customise the use. The Zone asked whether the app could be personalised and CT replied in the affirmative. The Education Zone were then asked what they thought students would like to see on the app at certain points in their University life, such as pre-application, pre-enrolment, and in Welcome week, all the way through to final year.

### 4. VP Education Update

VPE talked about the developments of the 'Shape and Size' Review and how this will affect student representation, including the change from Department Reps to School Reps. Faculty Co-ordinators will be renamed, becoming Faculty Reps.

VPE has also had an influence on the developments of iHull and Canvas, ensuring that student interests are represented at every stage. VPE will also be attending the NUS National Conference 2016 in Brighton, wherein elections for NUS positions will take place, in addition to votes on strategy and policy. VPE will be attending as an observer, meaning he cannot vote but can speak on issues and policy.

### 5. Update from Officers

#### a) Mature

The Officer gave an update on the Mature Students Survey which has garnered 175 responses. Feedback has been mostly positive, although some students had concerns over the fun questions that were inserted. The Officer has had a meeting to quash concerns, explaining that the light-hearted language was meant to encourage students to completion, particularly since mature students can range from 21 to 71. The Officer told the Zone that the Survey will continue for another week with a further e-mail sent out by the Mature Student Advisor, Karen Smales. A meeting will be made with the EC and the Research and Campaigns Co-ordinator, Chelsea Baxter, to discuss the data. Phil has also been liaising with next year's Officer to organise matters for next year.

The AC rep was politely reminded that motions must be proposed according to the guidelines and so the motion would need re-drafting. However, the rep was also praised for her desire to enact positive change.
