Faculty Representative Role Description

Faculty Reps have responsibility for representing students at Faculty level and working closely with Deputy Faculty Reps, Course Rep Leaders and Course Reps. This is a fantastic volunteer role at Hull University Students' Union and a great opportunity for someone with lots of drive, initiative, and determination to play a vital role in student representation. Faculty Reps work with senior staff in the University, and also have a seat on Union Council, enabling them to have a say in Hull University Students' Union governance and policy.

Aim:

The Faculty Rep will support, inform and direct Course Rep Leaders and Course Reps within their Faculty by offering guidance and leadership, while assisting in the enhancement of academic practices by providing crucial feedback to the University and Hull University Students' Union. Faculty Reps will represent the student voice at Faculty level and will have major input into the direction and quality of education at the University.

Key Responsibilities:

- Complete Hull University Students' Union Faculty Rep training
- Represent the views of students within the Faculty
- Hold regular meetings with Course Rep Leaders to gather feedback, provide information updates, and motivate and support them in their role
- Meet regularly with your Faculty's Associate Dean for Student Experience and attend relevant Faculty meetings
- Build a strong relationship with fellow Faculty Reps, Course Rep Leaders and Course Reps within the Faculty, Faculty staff, and Hull University Students' Union staff
- Attend and contribute to the Education Zone (6 per year) and Union Council (6 per year)
- Contribute to quality procedures at the University. Two members will sit on Senate and two will attend as observers
- Engage students in their faculty on policy developments of Union Council
- Campaign on educational issues
- Be a visible presence within the Faculty (Social media/notice boards etc.)
- Attend Education Zone Open Meetings 5 per year
- Attend relevant Student-Staff Forums throughout the year (optional)
