

M.1617-18 Motion to mandate Union Council members to have compulsory engagement time

HUU Notes:

1. Currently, both full-time Officers (FTOs) and part-time Officers (PTOs) are encouraged to spend time engaging with members about relevant HUU and UoH matters. This is indicated through Officer reports which are submitted to UEC and relevant Committees/Zones. As of present, this is only a guideline, with no formalities to enforce, aside from questions surrounding accountability, but these are purely optional.
2. Whilst Officer hours are part of their reports, these are often only seen by relevant Committees/Zones. The website where UEC reports are [available](#) is rarely visited.

HUU Believes:

1. Students feel that Officers are “out of touch”, and distanced from the general student body.
2. There is nothing in place to ensure engagement hours are carried out and communicated to students and Union Council.
3. If this was the case it would help show that HUU is listening and taking on board feedback from its members.

HUU Resolves:

1. Mandate both part-time and full-time Officers to commit to monthly engagement time. This does not include time spent catching up with Committee/Zones members (i.e. Zone meetings, one-to-ones). This could include (but is not limited to) face to face communication, Student Sofa, AU Council, or similar future projects. This may encourage PTOs to join in with Student Sofa as well, for example.
2. This would take the form of 10% of hours per month within each role. The result of which should be included in Union Council updates/reports, not to be taken as read, and should be uploaded to the HUU website accordingly. This would exclude any holidays or breaks.
3. If an Officer cannot complete such, they should inform either their FTO (if it is a PTO in question), or their mentor (if it is a FTO in question). When reporting being unable to fulfil their engagement time, this would act as Apologies (i.e. too many

meetings, or assignments). This creates a mandate for them to record their hours, where they would have to report their hours to Union Council, for accountability. These could also be included in the student newsletter.

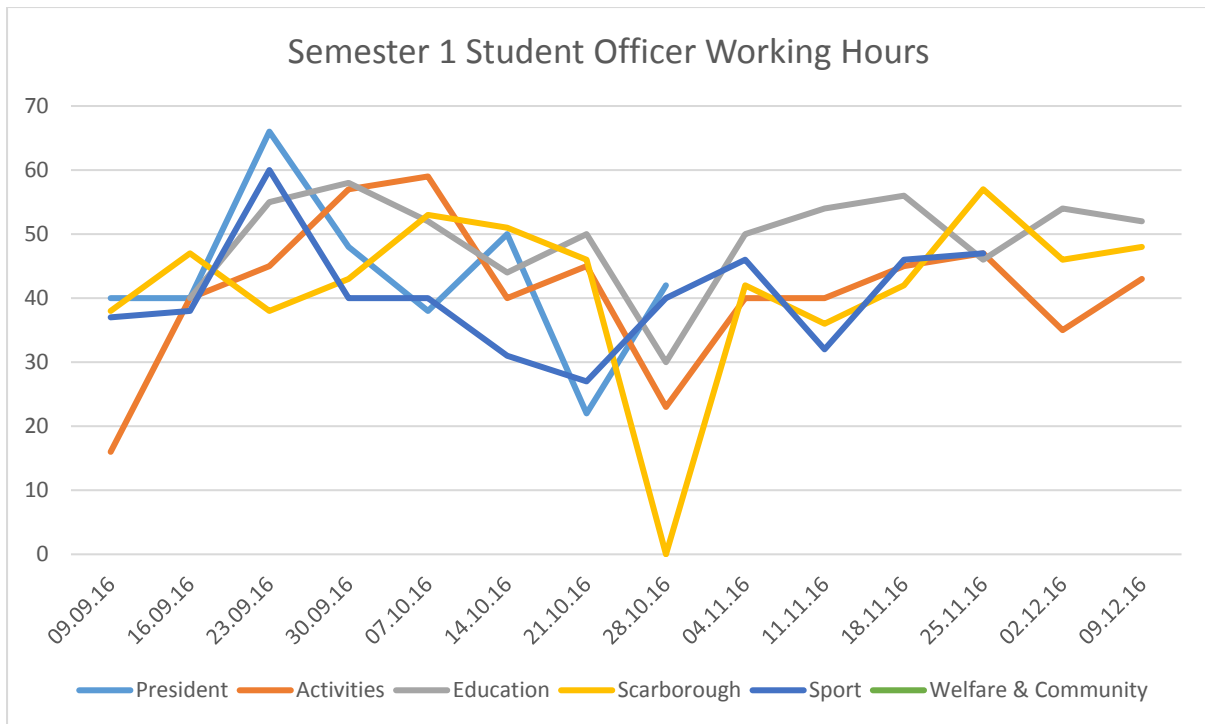
4. That this takes effect from Monday 3rd April 2017.

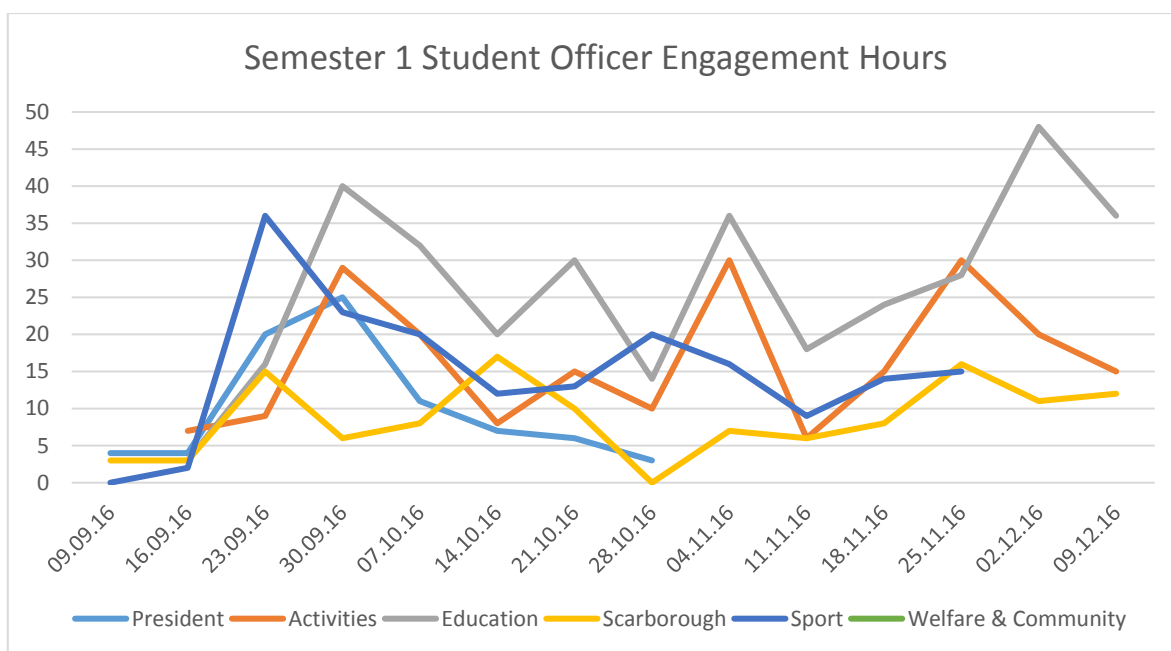
